Information as of March 28, 2018

### 1 What is *kambisita*?

*Kambisita* is a project of the Marawi City government and Task Force Bangon Marawi for displaced families to visit their homes and retrieve their personal belongings in the most-affected areas (MAA).

### 2 Who can visit the MAA?

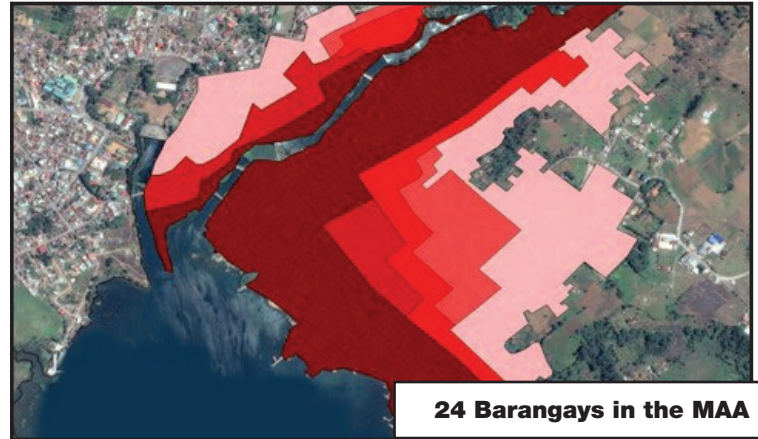
Seven representatives per structure per day can enter the MAA. They must be residents of the MAA and are 16 years old and above.



### 3 Is it safe to visit the MAA?

Extreme caution among residents is recommended during the visit. The military and a medical team from the Marawi city government will also be present to protect the security and health safety of residents.

Residents must submit their **proof of residency** and the **names of seven representatives per structure** to their respective barangay captains.

One vehicle per group of seven representatives



Food and water

It is advised for residents to wear:



Protective gears such as hard hats, hard-sole shoes and masks



Long jeans (*maong*) for protection against sharp metal sheets

### 6 What is the schedule of visitation?

Visitation will be divided into nine sectors from April 1, 2018 to May 10, 2018. All visitors must enter through **Mapandi Bridge at 6:00 am** and exit **Papandayan Bridge no later than 3:00 pm**.

**7 How can residents be safe during the day of the visit in the MAA?**



- a. Report firearms or illegal drugs found in the vicinity to authorities
- b. Vacate the area and report to authorities suspicious looking areas that appear to have UXOs, IEDs and/or skeletal remains

c. Duly follow instructions from authorities
